Commissioned by the British, Belgian and American secret services operating in London during WWII, more than 300 Belgian agents were parachuted or infiltrated from the United Kingdom into occupied territories.

Their secret missions to Belgium or neighbouring countries were intended to gather intelligence, spread anti-German propaganda, trigger or execute sabotage, liaise between allied authorities in London and local resistance organisations, help pilots and resistant fighters escape.

Doing so they contributed to 'set Europe ablaze' following the strategy designed in July 1940 by Winston Churchill. Moreover, they brought about that by the time it was liberated in the first days of September 1944, Belgium was able to lend allied secret services a useful hand in pursuing the job.

This book pays tribute to those agents who risked their lives to fight the Nazis, save democracy and leave a legacy of freedom.

The three authors belong to the Association of WWII Secret Agents. They were inspired by a large thesaurus of existing literature and indulged in thorough research into Belgian, British, American and German official archives.

In his foreword, Fabrice Maerten, historian attached to the War and Society Service (CEGESOMA) of the Belgian state Archives commands the book for representing an inescapable reference among the historiography of WWII Resistance in Belgium.

The 300 pages book is richly illustrated by graphs, pictures, maps and organigrams.
